## Restoration Plans For

The Hollow Advance

The Friends of The Hollow Inc., a society dedicated to restoring and preserving the 18th century dwelling of Col. Thomas Marshall near Markham, is proceeding with plans for its project.

Dr. Dell Upton, an authority on vernacular architecture, has been commissioned to survey The Hollow, make findings and drawings and catalogue its components by the first week in April.

John Pierce, a consultant in historic preservation, has agreed to serve as chairman of the committee for documenting records, sketches, writings and artifacts pertaining to the men and women who lived at The Hollow before the Revolution.

Mr. Pierce, who is director of George Washington University's graduate program in historic preservation, will be assisted by Mrs. William Triplett and

Mrs. Robert Stribling of Markham, Miss Anne Marshall of Marshall and John Randolph Marshall of McLean.

Mrs. Triplett is soliciting suggestions and advice from other historical and genological organizations.

The Hollow, now in a sad state of disrepair, will be a useful and enlightening documentary of frontier life in Fauquier when it has been restored.

The Friends of The Hollow will meet April 17 to discuss Dr. Upton's findings and make plans for implementing them.

The organization, recently incorporated, has been granted tax exempt status by the Internal Revenue Department.
